INSECURITY IN THE LAND.

We need your prayers more than before because our roads, homes, Churches, and work places are unsecured. For instance this is just some days that I begin to think normal, in accordance to the Doctors that I was under heavy fears and shocks of armed robbery attack that took place on 5 Nov 2011. A

woman attempted to kill me in August 2011, and serious explosives/ bombs everywhere in the Northern-Nigeria. All of these are stressful on me, but is now recovering from all these mess.

The literacy centers, Steward Model School, and Church attendance are low some times because of fear next bomb explosive.

The elders, deacons, and all Christian's prayers for us are

seriously needed because our lives/properties are under serious threats of Boko haram sects.

Today and every day we go to bed with one eye close and another open, so PRAY FOR US as usual.

Doka

What Doka is telling us is that he has been under such stress that it has affected his health and mental state. I think it is impossible for us to imagine the violent and hostile world in which our brother Doka lives. The news has had many reports of the violence and aggressiveness of Boko Haram. Many have been killed. Doka told us of this movement when he was last here.

Doka's birth in Christ was in the context of witchcraft, Islam and violence. You remember how the postmaster burned his first WBS Bible to save him from the reaction of his own village. You remember how his own father threatened him and how the family conspired to murder him when they learned he had become a Christian.

Yet Doka persevered. He returned to Keffi to

teach about Jesus. He was accepted into the council of elders because of the power of his faith. Now, he faces new threats from radical Islamists.

Few of us would be able to endure in these circumstances. Just hours south, in his own country, hundreds of thousands of Christians worship and teach Jesus with little fear or danger. But in the north, in Doka's world, the Enemy is very powerful.

In Abuja, the federal capitol, Doka continues to teach literacy and to teach Jesus. The state has recognized and honored him for his efforts to improve the lives of his fellow-citizens.

I want us to focus prayers very intently on Doka's safety and the power of the gospel to penetrate the darkness of northern Nigeria. He left me a voicemail on Saturday to wish us all a happy Christmas and new year.

I am thankful to God that we have the blessing of holding up his hands with financial support and in prayer. (In addition to monthly support, a special gift made it possible to send Doka \$10,000 just before the end of the year.)
