A Preacher's Perspective

I'm tempted to be a little apologetic here. But I won't apologize. I'm going to continue to reflect on my sense of loss at the passing of our brother Justin. I am so grateful to have been able to say some words at his funeral, but there are so many others I have thought to say.

A couple of times I have driven by his new grave, and I have thought how unlike his world that scene is. Quiet. Solitary. But he is surrounded by love and life and the aura of our Lord Jesus. And I love that.

But back to my reflections. I asked myself

why I should feel such an impact at the passing of this sweet friend. One thought that has come to me several times is that in all the 20+ years I have known him, he was never angry with me. He never was critical of me or my work.

Now, he was very smart. I know he had to see my failings, just as you see them. But he always showed me perfect respect and courtesy. I believe that was not because of my flawless life, but because of his deep respect for my position as a minister and an elder.

His kindness and patience with me convicts me of my responsibility to show that kind of patience and kindness to others.

Isn't it remarkable how the Lord Jesus could walk

for those years with His friends and never question their suitability to carry on His amazing mission? He found them completely trustworthy to be His ambassadors.

Impetuous. Ambitious. Ill-tempered. Political activists. Materialistic. Un-educated. Unsophisticated. Hicks. Hayseeds. All these descriptors are pretty appropriate to describe the band of followers to whom

Jesus entrusted the salvation of the world and the demonstration to the angels and demons of the glory and perfection of His plan.

He never doubted them. Justin never doubted me (at least that I knew of). And we should never



doubt one another.

The point is that if we will be busy loving, forgiving and serving one another, it will be pretty hard to find reason or occasion to be upset with each other.

Justin and I often talked about the grace of God in our lives. We agreed that it made no sense that God should have poured out on us the blessings we both have enjoyed. I know so many of you feel exactly the same way. What a rich fellowship of gratitude we share in that. Let's commit to keep kindness and gratitude a growing reflection of Jesus in our lives.

You'll be patient if I have other reflections later, as well.

Please note: Let's try to get this completed in the next couple of weeks! And...please don't be camera-shy!


Teen Parent Connection
