A Preacher's Perspective

Perfect. That's a powerful and intimidating word, isn't it? Remember when Jesus said, "Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect."? When you read this text, doesn't it make you squirm a little?

One of my very favorite "perfect" stories of Jesus is the time he cleared out the temple, in **Matt. 21.** He was deeply hurt and offended by the disrespect of the vendors. They had set up booths, not to help with worship, but to profit from the sincere worshipers who were "fleeced" like sheep by these unscrupulous rascals. Jeremiah had called the temple of his day a "den of robbers." Jesus quotes him. boundaries were in their own hearts of fear.

But there were some who felt no fear at all. They were completely at ease and drew themselves eagerly to the side of this powerful Rabbi.

These were the lame and the blind. They came to be healed, and they found what they were looking for.

And the children. They sang to Him, "Hosanna to the Son of David! It was a Messianic song. They could not have really even understood its depth and real meaning.

But they knew it applied to this gentle friend with the terrible power. They liked the temple better in the peace of Jesus, I think. They may have been a bit frightened by all the chaos and the atmosphere of greed and exploitation which had been there just

minutes before.

But now, they were free to sing, and to worship from young hearts.

And how Jesus loved their son. The con men were

turned over tables and drove people out. To see Jesus in a mood like that must have been terrible to behold. He was certainly always under control, but I would imagine that some of those there might have felt a bit of the complete irresistible power of this Man who could still oceans with a word. They knew His anger was for them.

They stepped back.

In my mind, the scene is one in which many were driven out. There was a kind of invisible barrier to their entrance back into the temple precincts. The indignant. They challenged Jesus for receiving such praise.

He basked in it. He savored it. He delighted in each skinned knee and each dirty hand and each beautiful face of these pure worshipers. He quoted **Psalm 8,** and called their praise, "perfect."

You and I want to never forget the perfection of the hearts of children. Our praise must become like theirs to be acceptable.
