It's that wonderful day when we prove our inadequacy in expressing to our mothers how precious they are to us. They are the experts in building up and showing genuine appreciation. They've been working at it since our first words, our first steps, and our first refrigerator-art.

I'm one of those men who is not good at understanding, intuitively, how to show my appreciation. I have made some slight progress in these 45 years, but not much!

Now, you all know my story. Many of you

knew my mom, and virtually all of you know my wife. So, I clearly have been blessed in the outstanding mom category. And I have also been blessed with awesome daughters-in-law.

In addition to my personal good fortune in the mom department, I am richly blessed with a church family

full of absolutely wonderful mothers, grandmothers, and even great-grandmothers.

But my deepest sense of wonder and amazement at motherhood comes from what I continue to learn about God, the inventor and designer of mothers.

Simply put, God put into mothers unique and invaluable aspects of His own nature. He is perfectly

feminine as well as completely masculine. He created <u>us</u> in His own image.

I delight in the beauty and grace of women, and of little girls. As I was coming home from California, in Midway Airport, I saw a mom and daughter, she was about 6, getting ready for a plane trip adventure. The delight on the face of that little girl, how she clasped her hands together made me laugh out loud. That's something for a sourpuss like me!

But the depth of spiritual power in godly women is truly wonderful. For example, mothers truly embody the quality of comfort. When our souls need a place of refuge, we need our moms. You may remember one of my favorite psalms in demonstration

of this quality: "1 My heart is not proud, O LORD, my eyes are not haughty; I do not concern myself with great matters or things too wonderful for me. ² But I have stilled and quieted my soul: like a weaned child with its mother, like a weaned child is my soul within me." Psalms 131:1-2 (NIV)



That is God's design for the place of ultimate comfort and security: in the arms of a loving mother.

Those, of course, are the arms of God in human form. How grateful we are that He has loaned them so generously to our mothers.


