A Preacher's Perspective

The wise men from the east followed a special star to find the baby that had been born to Mary. They probably came hundreds, if not thousands, of miles. Their intention was to worship

this new born king, and they brought special gifts.

We know little about them. They may have heard of Jesus' prophecies through rabbis who had migrated to their lands. Or, they may have been given special revelation about the Christ directly by God. We just don't know.

Their encounter with Herod is interesting. From the miraculous leading of the star, it would seem that they didn't really need the directions of Herod. It may be that God used them to give testimony to Herod that there was a new king, and that his evil reign was near an end.

But, we know that they came. And they were led by that same star to the very house where Jesus and his family were staying. God then spoke to them in a dream and warned them to return home by a different route to avoid Herod. With that, they disappear from history.

Most agree that they were Gentiles. This new king born in Bethlehem was not the king only of the

Jews, but of the whole world. The Magi visit reminds us of that.

The wise men of our day are not so perceptive. The great men of the nations of our day are more inclined to unbelief. They don't see miraculous stars and signs. Indeed, they don't look for them.

Our wise men are blinded by fears, by greed, by ambition. They have been trained to reject spiritual understanding and knowledge, and they imagine this makes them men of sophistication and great intellect.

The kings of the east saw the sovereign hand of God and knew to follow and to worship. They knew this majesty was one which called for rich gifts.

And they were blessed. We don't know just how. But we see that they were chosen and we assume that God rewarded their pilgrimage of faith as He always rewards those who diligently seek Him.

The Magi remind us of the universal reign of God, of God's promise "I will be exalted among the nations."

The heavenly kingdom is one in which all the nations of the earth will gather around the great white throne to celebrate the Bethlehem-child.

Bobbye Miller was admitted to CDH on Friday night with pancreatitis. She is in room 274.


